## A TRANSFORMATIVE MOMENT

Every Jewish child loves Chanukah. Like most, I was drawn to its magic by the warm glow of the menorah, piping hot latkes, and of course, the lure of receiving presents each of eight nights. But for me – even as a child – the festival’s central feature was its awe-inspiring story. And I am not referring to the miracle of the oil.

It was the watershed account of Mattathias the High Priest that grabbed me. Basing herself on the First Book of Maccabees and the writings of Josephus, my Sunday School teacher, Ruth Stern, related how a company of Greek officers arrived in the town of Modi’in with the intention of forcibly implementing Antiochus’ anti-Jewish ordinances. They erected a platform for idolatrous sacrifice in the town square and ordered the region’s most highly esteemed citizen, Mattathias, to begin the proceedings by offering a pig and eating its meat. The elderly, dignified priest refused. But the presiding pagan officer was undeterred. With a sneer, he taunted the crowd that he’d find a Jew to do his bidding. Sure enough, one stepped forward and, in a demoralizing act of self-abasement, ate the forbidden flesh. Sensing that only purposive action could rescue the spirit of his people, Mattathias sprang forth and slew the traitor who had broken faith with God and his nation. Then he slew the bullying Greek. Turning to the crowd, he challenged them saying, “all who revere the Lord, follow me!” And they did. Forsaking creature comforts, they fled to the hills, organized themselves into crack military units, expelled the Seleucid tyrants, and restored Jerusalem’s Temple to its former glory. The few vanquished the many, the weak overcame the strong, the innocent threw off their oppressors.

The day my teacher told that story was a transformative moment for me. Never again could I have a casual relationship with my heritage. My imagination and passion were ignited. Right then and there, I made a commitment to keep the dietary laws, defend my people from humiliation, and reclaim Zion as our patrimony. In a flash, my identity as a Jew was set.

To this day, whenever Chanukah rolls around, I am transfixed by the nostalgic charm of its laws and customs. But more than that, I am galvanized by its story of physical courage and moral triumph.

The purpose of this message is to inform our members on the CSOI Rabbinic Search.

According to Aliyah: A Congregation’s Rabbinical Search Guide published by the Rabbinical Assembly, the task of selecting a spiritual leader can be a difficult, long and a tedious process. However, as CSOI overcomes the immensity of this task, the results will provide our membership an opportunity to reflect, identify core values, and grow.

To effectuate the task of selecting a spiritual and religious leader, we have created a Rabbinical Search Committee. Marcel Buchsbaum (Chair of the CSOI Ritual Committee) and I are co-chairpersons. There are 13 additional members who were selected from the Executive Committee, Board of Trustees and general membership.

In the months of July and August, we met to prepare and reflect as a group on the needs and aspirations of our congregation. We posed the question: “What are the set of skills we are looking for in our new Rabbi?” Moreover, we invited select members of our congregation to clarify their interpretation of “How do you describe our Ideal Rabbi?” Furthermore, we invited Rabbi Ginsburg to address this Committee to provide an anecdotal description of the challenges a new Rabbi will face based on four criteria: Interpersonal Relations, Teaching, a Model in Private and Public Life and a Team Player.

In the month of September, we met to create two sub-committees. We recognize that we may not be looking for the best rabbi, but we are certainly looking for the best Rabbinic fit for CSOI. Only when a congregation has a realistic grasp of its identity can it find a rabbi that will truly meet its real needs.

Consequently, our first sub-committee will strive to reach a consensus on the congregation’s core values, rituals, and priorities. The sub-committee will develop a description of our story to send to prospective candidates. The second sub-committee will begin to develop a draft of a contract. We invite members of our congregation to write to Marcel Buchsbaum (Marbu@aol.com) and Mark Kavarsky (mkavarsky@gmail.com) with their viewpoints on core values, rituals and priorities.

In the months of October and November, the RSC will meet to finalize our outreach to potential candidates. Four avenues are available to us. (1) Rabbi Ginsburg has graciously offered to assist us in finding and screening prospective candidates from the full array of institutions with which we will be consulting, (2) the

Board of Trustees voted unanimously to allocate funding for membership in the United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism (USCJ) which will permit us to utilize their extensive Career Center, (3) Members of our RSC have contacted Yeshivat Chovevei Torah (YCT) which ordains Rabbis under the direction of Rabbi Avi Weiss: and, (4) under the leadership of Harriet Gefen, we will advertise on the media.

I wish to thank the members of the Rabbinical Search Committee for volunteering to participate in, perhaps, the most difficult task a congregation can face. However, I am confident that we will prevail and present to the membership for your approval a Rabbi who we will be proud to call our own.


